

Airline Restrictions:

Airlines are enforcing size & weight restrictions strictly. In order to avoid issues at the airport always double check with your chosen airline before arriving.

Measuring and weighing your luggage?

The size of your luggage includes the height, length and width - be sure to include any handles and wheels as well as any expansion. After packing, weigh your bags before leaving for airport to ensure they will fit within the weight parameters.

What is considered a carry-on?

There are different standards between Domestic and International carry-ons. Most airlines require a carry-on be no larger than 22x14x9 including wheels. Please see your specific airline for their requirements

Domestic Carry-On's:

- Measures between 21-24" in height (including the wheels)
- No larger than 45 linear inches (calculated using height + length +width)
- Will comply with the FAA and fit into most domestic airline overhead bins
- Weigh limits vary by airline
- Holds 2-3 days of clothing

International Carry-On's:

- Measures between 17-21" in height (including the wheels)
- Weight limits vary by airline but as a general rule should weigh no more than 50 lbs. when packed.
- Will comply with the FAA and fit into most international and domestic overhead bins
- Holds 2-3 days of clothing

Medium- Sized Luggage:

- Measures between 24-26" in height
- Weight limits vary by airline but as general rule should weigh no more than 50 lbs. when packed. For luggage weighing over 50 lbs. most airlines will charge an oversized fee.
- Holds 5-7 days of clothing
- Most are expandable to allow for extra packing capacity
- Checked luggage is subject to TSA inspection - TSA approved locks help prevent damage to your luggage.

Large-Size Luggage:

- Measures between 27-33" in height
- Oversized for extended travel
- Holds up to two weeks of clothing
- Most are expandable to allow for extra packing capacity
- Checked luggage is subject to TSA inspection - TSA approved locks help prevent damage to your luggage.
